

Below are the 3 different phases the CDC is recommending states to use as they begin reopening. As we receive more information we will notify you as to which phase they are in.

<p>Phase One SPECIFIC TYPES OF EMPLOYERS</p> <p>SCHOOLS AND ORGANIZED YOUTH ACTIVITIES (e.g., daycare, camp) that are currently closed should remain closed.</p> <p>VISITS TO SENIOR LIVING FACILITIES AND HOSPITALS should be prohibited. Those who do interact with residents and patients must adhere to strict protocols regarding hygiene.</p> <p>LARGE VENUES (e.g., sit-down dining, movie theaters, sporting venues, places of worship) can operate under strict physical distancing protocols.</p> <p>ELECTIVE SURGERIES can resume, as clinically appropriate, on an outpatient basis at facilities that adhere to CMS guidelines.</p> <p>GYMS can open if they adhere to strict physical distancing and sanitation protocols.</p> <p>BARS should remain closed.</p>	<p>Phase Two SPECIFIC TYPES OF EMPLOYERS</p> <p>SCHOOLS AND ORGANIZED YOUTH ACTIVITIES (e.g., daycare, camp) can reopen.</p> <p>VISITS TO SENIOR CARE FACILITIES AND HOSPITALS should be prohibited. <p>Phase Three SPECIFIC TYPES OF EMPLOYERS</p> <p>VISITS TO SENIOR CARE FACILITIES AND HOSPITALS can resume. Those who interact with residents and patients must be diligent regarding hygiene.</p> <p>LARGE VENUES (e.g., sit-down dining, movie theaters, sporting venues, places of worship) can operate under limited physical distancing protocols.</p> <p>GYMS can remain open if they adhere to standard sanitation protocols.</p> <p>BARS may operate with increased standing room occupancy, where applicable.</p>
